You are welcome to bring your own favorite wood and tools.

Designed for all levels of experience, these workshops are accessible to everyone. Wooden eating, cooking and serving spoons make amazing gifts and can last a lifetime.

Hot beverages and water will be provided. Please bring your own lunch and snacks. Bring snowshoes and winter gear if you'd like to hike at lunch time!
